Entry Period

June 1st to August 10th 2018

Eligibility

- Only applicants aged 5-19 years from Public and Private Primary and Secondary Schools in Nairobi County are eligible to participate in the Kenya Climate Change Art and essay Writing Competition 2018
- Only one entry per applicant is allowed
- The recommended paper size is A3 or tabloid size (A4 sizes are also acceptable)
- Artworks must be able to withstand the rigors of handling
- All artworks should be the original artistic creation of the applicant
- It is illegal to submit pirated, plagiarized or copied artwork
- All applicants must duly complete the Entry Form and attach it to the artwork for recording, monitoring and retrieval purposes
- Artworks should be submitted no later than 5.00 pm August 10th, 2018

Unacceptable Artworks

- Artwork created on a computer or similar electronic devices
- Submissions that infringe on a third party's copyrights
- Collaborative artwork drawn by more than one individual
- Artwork created by a person other than the applicant
- Artwork with incomplete Entry Forms or missing information

Selection of winners

Judging Criteria

The artwork will be evaluated based on three criteria:

- Theme interpretation
- · Artistic merit and
- · Innovation.

Judging Process

- The Judging panel reserves the right to withdraw any award at any time should the entrant violate any of the rules and regulations of the competition or if the Judging panel deems, in any way, that granting the participant the award will damage the reputation of the supporting partner institutions or competition
- The decision of the Judging panel is final

Awards

- Finalists will be contacted by the Competition Secretariat through email/ telephone
- There will be twenty finalists; five winners per category.
- Finalists may be accompanied by their teachers/parents/ guardians to the Award Ceremony.
